As usual, the Sargodhian minority that changes problems into opportunities, this year, too, kept its tradition of excellence up. The 34th Entry Sargodhians swept the board positions clean by claiming the first three positions in the HSSC Exam - 2006. Hassaan Khan (2443-F), Ikrash Munir (2353-Fn) and Syed Waqar Raza not only secured the first three positions in Pre Engg Group but were also declared overall top scorers in the BI&SE Sargodha respectively.



Although the board does not announce the positions in the First year Exam, looking at the numbers obtained by Sargodhians, one can safely declare the positions. Saim Musharraf (2473-Sf) got the highest numbers, i.e. 490 followed by Arsalan Naeem (2478-Fn) with 488 marks. The third slot this year is shared by two Sargodhians, Ali Amjad (2463-Fn) and Adnan Manzoor (2483-S) with 483 marks each.



In the Matric Board Exam, the School sent 78 boys. Out of these 74 cleared their exam in A+ grade, whereas the remaining four boys passed it in A grade. M Bilal Alam (2613-Fn) with 966 marks was the leader, following his footsteps came Shehryar (2560-F) with 954 marks. The third place was once again shared by Bilawal (2536-Sf) and Mahad Nayyer (2597-T) with 952 marks each to their credit.



The Chief of the Air Staff, Air Chief Marshal Tanvir M Ahmed and the Vice Chief of the Air Staff, Air Marshal Raashid Kaleem conveyed their pleasure and appreciation for such outstanding performance by the boys and the school. They urged upon the students and the staff to be consistent with staunch belief in hard work.




