Like last year, this year, too, the School organized a **Mushaira** on 17 December, 2005. Renowned poets of the country warmed the hearts of a very receptive audience.

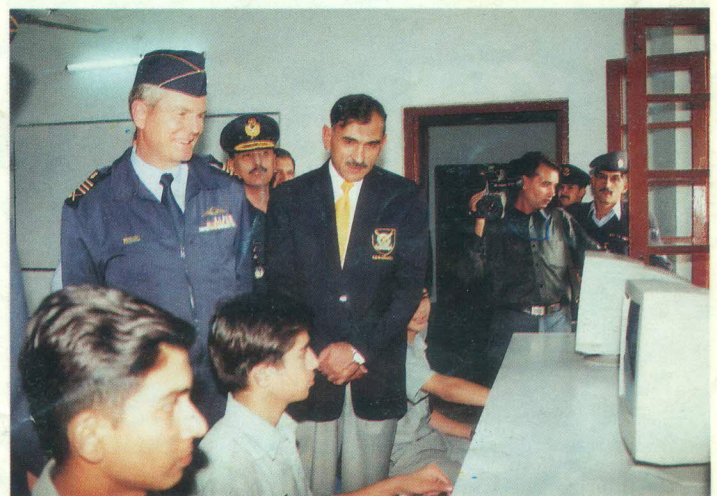

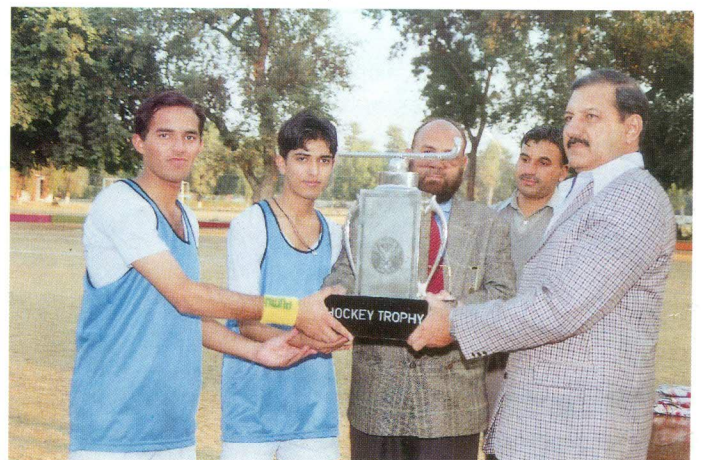
The final match was a treat to watch as both the teams displayed a heart-winning array of skills. For most of the first half the teams seemed bent on thwarting each others spirited attacks but in the last five minutes saw two stunning moves resulting in goals. First Shoaib (2465-Hf) opened the account for his team. Hardly had the echo of replay whistle died down than Danyal (2440-S) connected a sizzling pass into the goal. The next half was equally thrilling as the goalkeepers of both the teams experienced some of the toughest attacks from their opponents. However, in the last ten minutes, Halifaxians relentless forays resulted into a winner goal by Fahim Khaliq (2448-Hf). Later on Gp Capt Badar-z-Kayani, the Vice Principal, awarded the trophy to the exuberant Halifaxians.

Abdullah (2568-S) and Shoaib (2465-Hf) earned the distinction of being the top scorers of the tournament with four goals each to their credit.
