THE BOARD EXAMS

PAF Public School Sargodha once again swept the top positions in all the exams held by the Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education Sargodha for the year 2004.

In Fsc Part-II exam, 54 Sargodhians appeared and cleared the exam. Out of the first 25 positions in Pre Enga group 22 fell to the Sargodhians including the top three slots. Mohsin Javed (2188-Sf) and M Asim Jan (2209-Hf) earned the distinction of being the first and third in all candidates. 19 Sargodhians cleared the exam in Grade-A+, 29 in Grade-A, and 06 in Grade-B with a class average of 77%.

89 Sargodhians appeared for the Matric exam. All of the m passed. Out of first ten positions seven went to Sargodhians including second and third positions. M. Zirgham Iqbal obtained overall second position with 783/850 marks in the Board, whereas M Shafique-ur-Rehman secured third position with 771/850 marks. Three Sargodhians cleared the exam with distinction (i.e. 90%+ marks), 75 obtained Grade-A and 11 passed in B+ Grade. The overall average of marks is 84%.

In class 9 exam all Sargodhians have cleared their exam with three of the bous achieving distinction. 36 boys have obtained 85+%marks. Hopefully it will be a usual sweep of positions in the Matric Exam next year.
